OUR VISITING ARTISTS

Brian O'Connor

Brian O'Connor is a native of Albuquerque, having been born, raised and musically trained here. He attended Bandelier Elementary, Wilson Junior High and Highland High School and performed for Kenneth Anderson, Wallace Cleveland and in the Albuquerque Youth Symphony for Dale Kempter. Brian attended the New England Conservatory of Music and California Institute of the Arts and studied Horn with Paul Tafoya, Robert Elworthy, Philip Farkas, James Stagliano and Vincent DeRosa.

Brian's performance credits include participation on more than 2,300 movie scores with over 750 scores as Principal/Solo Horn, close to 100 TV series, numerous live TV projects including the Carol Burnett Show, The Emmys, The Grammys and many performances for the Oscars. Recent chamber music recording projects include *The Chamber Works* by Kevin Kaska and Jack Jarrett, *Hornworks* by Bruce Broughton and *A Hopeful Place* by Dan Redfield.

O'Connor was the Associate Adjunct Professor of Horn at UCLA from 1998 through 2009. A number of his students are working professionally in the LA Studios and orchestras around the world. He has also represented his community as the President of the Recording Musicians Association of Los Angeles (RMALA) for more than 6 years.

Bruce Broughton

One of the most versatile composers working today, Bruce Broughton writes in every medium, from theatrical releases and TV feature films to computer games. An accomplished composer of concert music, Broughton has conducted and recorded numerous original works.

Bruce is best known for his many film scores such as Silverado, Tombstone, The Rescuers Down Under, The Presidio, Miracle on 34th Street, the Homeward Bound adventures and Harry and The Hendersons, his television themes to JAG, Dinosaurs and Steven Spielberg's Tiny Toon Adventures, TV mini-series (Roughing It, The Blue and Gray), TV movies (Warm Springs, O Pioneers!), as well as countless episodes of TV series such as Dallas, Quincy, First Monday and Hawaii Five-O. He has been nominated for an Oscar and a Grammy and has won the Emmy a record ten times. His music has accompanied many of the Disney theme park attractions throughout the world. His score for *Heart of Darkness* was the first orchestral score for a CD-ROM game. Broughton's concert music includes numerous works for orchestra and chamber groups, performed by ensembles such as the Cleveland Orchestra, the Chicago Symphony and the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra. He is a board member of ASCAP and a past president of The Society of Composers and Lyricists. He is an adjunct professor in Scoring for Motion Pictures and Television for the Thornton School of Music at USC, and a lecturer in music composition at the UCLA Herb Alpert School of Music.
