### Rothko Chapel (1971)

Morton Feldman (1926–1987)

*Rothko Chapel was commissioned by the Menil Foundation in Houston TX. The space contains 14 large paintings by the American artist Mark Rothko in red, black and purple tones, which vary according to the light and which create an atmosphere of contemplation and tranquility. To this day, the Rothko Chapel building doubles as a center for colloquiums aimed at fostering mutual understanding on issues affecting justice and freedom throughout the world.*
