CHATTER

Six Metamorphoses after Ovid Opus 49 (1951)

Benjamin Britten (1913–1976)

The piece was inspired by Ovid's *Metamorphoses*. Each of the six movements is based on a character from Roman mythology and includes an inscription summarizing their story.

- 1 **Pan**, who played upon the reed pipe which was Syrinx, his beloved.
- 2 **Phaeton**, who rode upon the chariot of the sun for one day and was hurled into the river Padus by a thunderbolt.
- 3 **Niobe**, who, lamenting the death of her fourteen children, was turned into a mountain.
- 4 **Bacchus**, at whose feasts is heard the noise of gagging women's tattling tongues and shouting out of boys.
- 5 **Narcissus**, who fell in love with his own image and became a flower.
- 6 **Arethusa**, who, flying from the love of Alpheus the river god, was turned into a fountain.

Matthew Brown poet

Matthew Brown is a young poet born and raised in Albuquerque. An avid writer since his early childhood, Matthew first began slamming at his high school poetry club before making the city youth team and slamming competitively. Matthew has performed alongside some of Albuquerque's most seasoned poets, representing New Mexico two years in a row at Brave New Voices as a member of the *Unidos Poetry Collective* in 2012, and again as a finalist in 2013. Much of Matthew's writing explores history . . . history of the self, history of our country. Each poem is a look back on what went right and wrong with the human experience, and mirrors the anger, loss, and acceptance felt by those in his stories.
