II THE MUSIC & POETRY OF 2015 A (very) few highlights of the year past:

June – A massive group of 19 musicians performed Samuel Barber's Knoxville, Summer 1915. Twice! It was a Pay-What-You-Wish day of two sold-out performances at 10:30am and again at 3pm.

August – Metronomes – 100 of them! (And here I'll insert a note about Chatter's international notoriety! We received an email from a traveling Chatter regular who, in Belgium, was speaking to directors of the Musical Instrument Museum in Brussels. She mentioned the recent Chatter concert that included Ligeti's piece for metronomes. One of the Belgians then said "and a Bach piece played by James Shields?") Wow, worldwide awareness!

September 5 – Chatter at the Acropolis. A great feat atop a downtown parking ramp featuring a rainstorm, a double rainbow, the sunset and falling darkness — and brilliant performances.

September 20 – Chatter's first performance in our beautiful new home at Las Puertas.

Artistic Directors David Felberg and James Shields pulled out all the stops. 11 Chatter musicians plus visiting fab violinist, Tricia Park. Prokofiev Duo for Two Violins during which David and Tricia brought us to our knees. Amy Beach Sonata for Violin & Piano. Ending with a stunning performance of Debussy's L'après midi d'un faune . . . go Jesse!





The following Sunday, our beloved Conor Hanick came from NYC and gave the first solo piano concert in our new home on the 100 year-old Mason & Hamlin – an unforgettable 60+ minutes of Hans Otte's *The Book of Sounds*.

December 31 We ended the year with a sensational concert of Mahler's *Symphony No 9* in the snowstorm of the century — you stalwart folks came and the show went on!

Chatter at the Museum offered, to record crowds, four wild and wonderful concerts relating to the Albuquerque Museum's summer exhibition *Killer Heels*.
