Norbert Krapf, emeritus professor of English at Long Island University, moved back to his native Indiana from the New York area in 2004 and since then has published seven books, including *Songs in Sepia and Black and White* (2012) and *American Dreams: Reveries and Revisitations* (2013), and a jazz and poetry CD with pianist Monika Herzig, *Imagine*. As Indiana Poet Laureate 2008–10, Norbert had a mission of reuniting poetry and song, and his collaboration with bluesman Gordon Bonham, who has also become his guitar teacher, began as part of their work together in the Hoosier Dylan show. With his recent Creative Renewal Fellowship from the Arts Council of Indianapolis to combine poetry and the blues, he took two trips to the Mississippi Blues Trail and another trip to Memphis. Norbert points out that the work of Delta bluesman Robert Johnson and Long Island poet Walt Whitman inspired him to start writing poetry in 1971. In 2014, Greystone Publishing will release his collection *Catholic Boy Blues*, 135 poems about being the survivor of childhood sexual abuse by a priest.
