Pianist Fred Sturm has specialized in the music of Latin America, and of Brazilian composer Heitor Villa-Lobos in particular, for more than 25 years. In spring of 2012 Sturm organized a four-concert festival devoted to Villa-Lobos' music, celebrating the composer's 125th birthday, in which he performed both as a solo pianist and in various ensembles. He has recently presented the music of Villa-Lobos to the national convention of the College Music Society, to the New Mexico state convention of the Music Teachers National Association, and in various other educational and cultural venues. Over the past two years, he has performed a varied repertory by Mexican and Spanish composers as well as Villa-Lobos in venues in the United States, Mexico, and Germany.
