*Hermit Songs*, a cycle of ten songs for voice and piano, takes as its basis a collection of anonymous poems written by Irish monks and scholars from the 8th to the 13th centuries in translations by W. H. Auden, Chester Kallman, Howard Mumford Jones, Kenneth Jackson and Sean O'Faolain. The *Hermit Songs* received their premiere in 1953 at the Library of Congress with soprano Leontyne Price and Samuel Barber himself as pianist.
