Verbo • bala is the recipient of a 2012 Artist Project Grant from the Arizona Commission on the Arts for their work-in-progress based on Phillips' upcoming book *The Sonoran Strange*. He also works as Director of the Tucson Youth Poetry Slam, which he co-founded in 2010 to widen access to critical literacy through dynamic, diverse and youth-centered events. During its first year, the program reached more than 5,000 students across Arizona.
