This piece is drawn from *Einstein on the Beach*, an opera in four acts (framed and connected by five "knee plays" or intermezzos). The premiere took place on July 25, 1976 at the Avignon Festival in France. It is Glass's first and longest opera score, taking approximately five hours in full performance without intermission; given the length, the audience is permitted to enter and leave as desired. *Knee Play #2* is approximately 6 minutes long.
