Elias-Axel Pettersson, piano

Born in Sweden and raised in New Mexico, Mr. Pettersson began playing piano and violin at an early age. He received his B.A. in music (and minor in biology) at the University of Rochester; concurrently, he studied piano with Douglas Humphreys and violin with Guillaume Tardif at the Eastman School of Music. Pettersson received his M.M. from the University of Maryland, College Park, as a student of Larissa Dedova, and he is currently a doctoral candidate at the Université de Montréal as a student of Paul Stewart

Mr. Pettersson is a laureate of several competitions, including the 21st International Young Artist Piano Competition, the 2005 Audio Express Recording Competition, and the 8th Los Angeles Franz Liszt International Piano Competition. He is a Mason & Hamlin Artist.

Ralph Berkowitz (former dean Tanglewood Music Festival) has said, "Elias-Axel Pettersson is one of those rare musicians who can project his ideas from the piano directly into the hearts and minds of his audience. He possesses formidable technique and the marks of a genuine artist."
