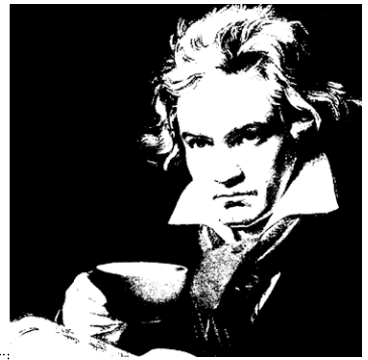

George Ann Gregory, Ph.D. is Choctaw/Cherokee, co-founder of the Voices of the Earth Threatened Languages Poetry Reading, and founder of *Ho Anumpoli*, a charitable organization that promotes the survival of the indigenous peoples of the Americas through languages and cultures. A Senior Fulbright Scholar, Dr. Gregory is a language revitalization and American Indian Studies specialist. She began writing when she was twelve and has never quit. In addition to writing, she also dances with Ehecatl Aztec dance group.
