

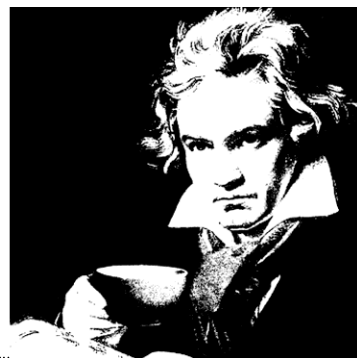

Michael Henson is a poet, fiction writer, essayist, and singer-songwriter living in Cincinnati, Ohio. His novel, *Ransack*, has been called, “a first novel almost perfect of its kind.” Margaret Randall has said of his poetry, “Whether along the creeks and streams of his own southern Ohio or in outward forays to New York, Los Angeles, New Mexico’s Jemez Plaza or Jimmy’s Bar in Beckley, West Virginia, Michael Henson creates a history of seasons and places that fuses mind and heart. These poems are living memories. They go deep and stay with us, reminding us to pay attention: poetry’s most important job. I have rarely been so moved.” He is a member of the Southern Appalachian Writers Cooperative and plays mandolin for the Old Coney Bluegrass Band. He works as a substance abuse counselor with homeless alcoholics.
