

## James Burbank Spoken Word

James Burbank is an Albuquerque multi-media artist, poet, photographer, and author of more than two hundred articles, often accompanied by his own photographs, in publications such as Reuters, Los Angeles Herald Examiner, Gnosis, Village Voice, Financial Planner, National Catholic Reporter, Financial Times, Albuquerque Journal, Albuquerque Tribune, and New Mexico Magazine. He is author of the Southwest classic, Vanishing Lobo: The Mexican Wolf and the Southwest (Johnson Books, 1990). His long poem, Untitled Outbursts, appears on Dispatches from the Poetry Wars (dispatchespoetrywars.com). His most recent book, OxBow Poems: Slow Walks on the Rio Grande (Duende Press, 2015) features Burbank's photography, poems and essays. He has done voice work featured in the PBS documentary, Osimi, and the short film, The History of What's a Gonna Happen, to promote Albuquerque sculptor Ed Haddaway's work that has been selected for the Venice Biennalle, 2019. Burbank's poetry/photography assemblages have been shown at the April Price Gallery, ACOG and New Mexico Arts League Gallery. He is former director of the UNM Professional Writing Internship Program in the English Department, where he taught for many years before recently retiring.
